Vacancy for a Parish Councillor:

Parish Watch:

Thefts of metal and now fuel are increasing, fortunately less here than elsewhere. Please be very vigilant. Large agricultural vehicles such as combines can be a target. Farlow & Oreton Parish Council have just joined us making our network of eyes wider than ever.

Proposed parking on land at Glebe Drive

The occupants of the houses and bungalows in Glebe Drive will remember Bridgnorth District Council's letter in the summer of 2007 asking their views on the proposal. There was majority agreement and Stottesdon and Sidbury Parish Council have now moved forward in the following way:-

1. We have agreed a budget for the funding of six off street parking bays for the use of short stay visitors to village and school events.
2. The project will cost £13,532 which will be funded in the following way, £5532 from the Parishes own resources comprising of £650 Calor Gas prize [Village of the Year]; £1200 06/07 Lengthsman's Scheme; £1000 budgeted in the precept; £255 VAT repayments; £2427 from reserves, Total £5532.00. The remaining £8000.00 will be borrowed. This was agreed at the Parish Council meeting on 28th July 2008.
3. Before a Parish Council can borrow money, permission has to be obtained from the Secretary of State - this has now been granted and at the Parish Council meeting on September 22nd it was agreed to apply for a loan from the Public Works Loan Board.
4. The County Council Highways Dept. have offered to do the work required at the same time as they extend the existing lay-by and realign the kerbs.
5. The Parish Council have had to apply for Planning Permission from Bridgnorth District Council which we hope will be processed in time to join up with the County's scheme.
6. The Parish Council hope this will help to alleviate the parking problems which exist in the area next to the school, and thank all the local people living in that area for their tolerance during this work.

Housing Development in Chorley:

Our long awaited housing scheme by Shropshire Rural Housing Association will start on October 3rd 2008. These two and three bed roomed houses will be for rent in perpetuity and for local people only. Application forms are available from the Parish Council Clerk Mrs Freda Morris and from Bridgnorth District Council to be added to their housing waiting list.

Completion date will be [weather permitting] July 2009, interviews for prospective tenants will start in June 2009.

Four Parishes Heritage Group:

December 4th at 7.30pm in Chorley Village Hall will provide an update and displays of the evidence including 'Finds' the Group have made during this project.

Village Speed Limit:

It was unanimously agreed at the Parish Council meeting on 22nd September that a 30mph speed limit be introduced in Stottesdon.

Local action and successes on the Climate Change campaign trail:

With rising fuel and energy costs still dominating the news, we can report good progress on three initiatives which are positively reducing energy consumption and Carbon Footprints in this parish. If you'd like to get involved, then please call Chris & Clare 718007 or Richard & Joe on 718693

+Community Plastic Bottle Recycling - 35,000 bottles have been diverted from landfill by our volunteers, for re-use in drainage pipes and garden furniture in two years; saving 1¾ tonnes of damaging CO₂ Carbon emissions.

+Village Hall Light Bulb Library - encouraging use of new Low Energy Bulbs with samples for everyone to try at home before buying, and discounts available on your first purchase. FREE energy-efficient light bulbs were handed out at Chorley Show courtesy of Marches Energy Agency - and we have some more to give away, while stocks last, at The Village Hall events.

+Chorley Show: Low Carbon Travel Plan - Barclays Bank sponsored a 'free to use' carbon-friendly shuttle-bus for this year's Chorley Show and people who left their cars at home benefited from reduced price admission. We hope to gain funding to do a similar thing again next year.

Parish Paths - another seasonal reminder to landowners:

May we take this opportunity to remind landowners and others with footpaths and bridleways over their land that seasonal clearance work to ensure that the paths are kept open and accessible may now be overdue?

Please help to avoid unnecessary difficulties and complaints by restoring any inadvertently ploughed-out paths, by 'spraying out' any crop obstructions, and by trimming-back bridleway hedgerows. It would be most helpful if particular attention could be paid to the promoted 'Stoty Stroll' paths since these are more likely to be used than some other routes. Thank you for your co operation.

Everyone who came along on Sunday 17 August - a fairly dry day in a rotten wet summer - seems to have had a great time! The Pig Racing went down a treat - as did the chance to throw a pot with Wenlock Pottery, the Craft and Produce Marquee, food from the BBQ and refreshment marquee, the Family Fun Dog Show attracted 143 entries and loads more went on.

As always, the Show focused on raising funds for the Village Hall and other local 'good causes' - and the Show raised a magnificent £6,000. Gifts of £2,000 each have just been given to our chosen 2008 charities: this year we have also supported the amazing work of Willowdene Farm (who are always among the Show's greatest supporters) and of Shrewsbury's Rainbow Oncology Unit (which provided specialist care and such tremendous support to Harry, Karen and Mark). So many thanks to all who came along or helped in other ways with this record local fundraiser!

Shropshire Link transport changes—report provided by Shropshire County Council:

Shropshire County Council research shows that there are just 57% of households able to access their local/closest market town/essential services by public transport on 2 day a week or more. The roll out of the flexible ShropshireLink enhancement to services will be part of a county wide increase on this indicator to 95% of households.

The greatest enhancement to the current network will be for those living in rural areas such as those surrounding Stottesdon. Residents living in these communities are currently served by traditional fixed route services (including the 751 and 132, when they are currently in walking distance of a stop) on as little as one day each week: this leaves a large number of residents without access to any bus service at all. In most cases these existing services are also provided using large, high fuel consuming, high stepped vehicles which are deemed as being unsuitable for the rural environment in which they operate. Under the strategy these services will be enhanced to be provided by a network of 9 demand responsive transport services ("ShropshireLink") operating in all rural areas of the County on a minimum of two days each week. These services will be available to all residents not just those living on a fixed bus route. Concessionary pass holders will be able to travel for free.

The flexible services will be provided by modern, easily accessible low floor vehicles making it easy to access for the less mobile, passengers in wheelchairs and those with children's buggies. Because the service runs on demand it will also be able to provide a service door to door where this is deemed as being appropriate. Conversely if no one requests a journey the vehicle will not operate further and fuel will be saved/emissions reduced.

In order to gain maximum efficiency from the Shropshire Link services, and to enable the vehicles to be available as widely as possible, passengers can be fed into the core bus network for onward travel to their chosen destination. This will allow the Shropshire Link vehicles to remain in the rural areas providing services through the day. For those residents in the Stottesdon area, 2 day a week services will be available on demand south to both Cleobury Mortimer and Ludlow (via interchange with 292), and north on to Bridgnorth. Journeys further afield will also remain available, including onward travel to Kidderminster via interchange with the 291/2 or 125 services.
